Reciprocal Scheme - 2009

It is with much pleasure that the Club can announce that a reciprocal agreement, has been set up between Beau Desert and St Anne's Old Links Golf Clubs

This allows members to visit and play a round of golf for prevailing member's guest rate, representing excellent value from the normal visitor rates.

Information for Members on how to use the Scheme

1. To make a booking contact the Secretary's Office at the course you wish to visit. Giving your name(s), contact telephone number and that the booking is via the 'Passport Scheme'.
2. Proof of membership will be required either in the form of a handicap certificate or members card.
3. On arrival, report to the Professional to pay the required green fees and present your handicap certificate or membership card as proof of identity/membership.

Please adhere to the 'spirit' of the scheme and the Terms and Conditions as set out below

Terms and Conditions

- The Passport scheme is a reciprocal arrangement allowing members of Beau Desert and St Anne's Old Links to play a round of golf for the members guest rate, instead of the normal visitors fee;
- The scheme is unfortunately **not** open to Junior, Social and Country Members;
- The scheme is only available from Monday to Friday (excluding Bank Holidays), subject to the availability of tee times;
- The offer is only open to members of the afore mentioned clubs (you could not, for example, take a guest from another club to play with you unless they pay the full visitor rate);
- When paying green fees, evidence must be provided to prove that you are a member of one of the aforementioned clubs (a handicap certificate or membership card will be sufficient).
- If no proof of membership can be provided, the full visitors fee will be levied;
- The scheme will be reviewed regularly by the participating golf clubs. Clubs may resign with 30 days notice (honouring any outstanding bookings at the reduced rate) if they feel that the costs of the scheme outweigh benefits to members;
- Members must adhere to the correct dress code of the course that you are visiting. Failure to do so will result in either not being allowed to play or asked to leave the Clubhouse;
- Please be considerate when taking advantage of the offer. The Clubs will not accept more than 2 'tee' reservations per day. If more than 8 wish to play in a group, please contact the Club Secretary, who can advise you on party rates;
- Members will not be allowed under the 'passport scheme', to play at the same Club more than 2 times per year.
- The participating Golf Clubs may, at any time, rescind a member's ability to take advantage of the scheme, if it is felt that they are not adhering to the standards of behaviour of the member courses, or the spirit in which the passport has been set up.
